- II6** Billi Billi Pinot Grigio 2007, Mount Langi Ghiran, Australia 20.00
 Delicate and refreshing. Enticing citrus fruit aromas lead to green apples and minerals on the palate. 4.95/6.90
- II7** Colterenzio 'Classici' Alto Adige, Pinot Grigio 2007, Italy 27.00
 A full bodied wine with a lightly floral bouquet. Almonds, melon and pineapple can be found on the palate giving way to a fresh and concentrated balanced wine.
- II8** Livio Felluga, Pinot Grigio 2007, Fruili Italy 36.50
 Felluga's vineyards lie within view of the borders of Switzerland and Slovenia. The fruit is estate grown giving the winemaker true control of his wine, which are with no bias, all stunning. The Pinot Grigio has aromas of peaches and apricots with an almost creamy and honeyed finish.
